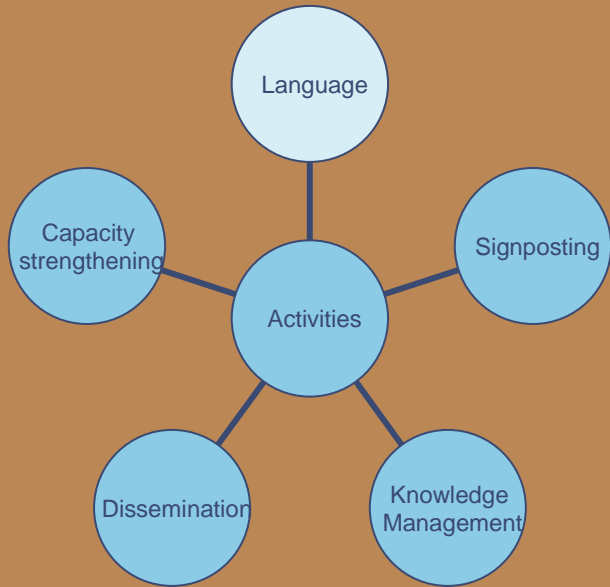
Adrian Walsh and the Core Management Group have recently met, the outcome of which was a draft Knowledge Management (KM) Strategy, which was distributed to the group for comments.
