The 2010 Bridging the Gap expert workshop invites participants to have a closer look at tackling climate change in the land transport sector: What kind of policies countries can take advantage in order to develop short- and long-term measures and how could international support be organized in a Post 2012 framework? The concept of sustainable transport itself will be challenged, debated and applied to cases and situations from developing countries, in order to understand what promoting sustainable development in the transport sector means for today's policymakers in developing countries.

The workshop presents an excellent opportunity for participants to engage with international leaders, policymakers and experts in discussing today's climate change policy issues and share experiences and best practices.

OBJECTIVES

- Gain understanding on how challenges can be turned into opportunities for sustainable transport, through interactions with political leaders, practitioners, and academics.
- To develop innovative and doable policy recommendations on how climate financing can help tapping the GHG mitigation potentials in the transport sector.
- To establish a network for decision-makers dedicated to being part of the solution to the climate change challenges faced today.

TARGETED PARTICIPANTS

Approximately 50-80 participants will be attending consisting of transport and policy experts, decision-makers in transport and urban planning, practitioners and academics of public policy from Germany, Asia, and beyond. A number of prominent public policy figures and leaders from Asia and the world are invited to address and debate with the audience.

By plane:

From Cologne/Bonn airport: Airport bus SB 60 to Bonn Central Station (Hauptbahnhof)
S-Bahn lines 16, 63, 66, 67, 68 to "Heussallee / Museumsmeile". From here, follow the signs for the "Ministerium für wirtschaftliche Zusammenarbeit und Entwicklung", cross Welckerstraße and turn left into Karl-Carstens-Straße. Then turn again left to the entrance to

the premises of Dahlmannstraße 4.
