## About the Programme

### Objectives

The Programme is designed to bring together experts in Road Management, Senior Road Executives, Managers and Engineers in a challenging forum to learn about and discuss the latest advances in Sustainable Roads.

## Venue



The Programme will be held in the School of Civil Engineering, which lies at the heart of the University of Birmingham's beautiful Edgbaston Campus. It was founded more than 100 years ago and has a long and rich tradition of discovery, invention and design in engineering, the sciences and arts. Birmingham is one of the leading teaching and research institutions in the UK with approximately 28,000 students from 150 countries studying for undergraduate, postgraduate and research degrees in a large variety of subjects in engineering, physical sciences, arts and the humanities. The Highways Group within the School of Civil Engineering has an international reputation as the premier group specialising in road management and engineering.



## Accommodation

Accommodation is included in the cost of the course fees for bookings confirmed by 28<sup>th</sup> February 2010. The Accommodation provided is in the Ibis Hotel which is in the middle of Birmingham City Centre, 3 minutes walk from the famous Bull Ring Shopping Centre and 15 minutes by vehicle from the University of Birmingham.
