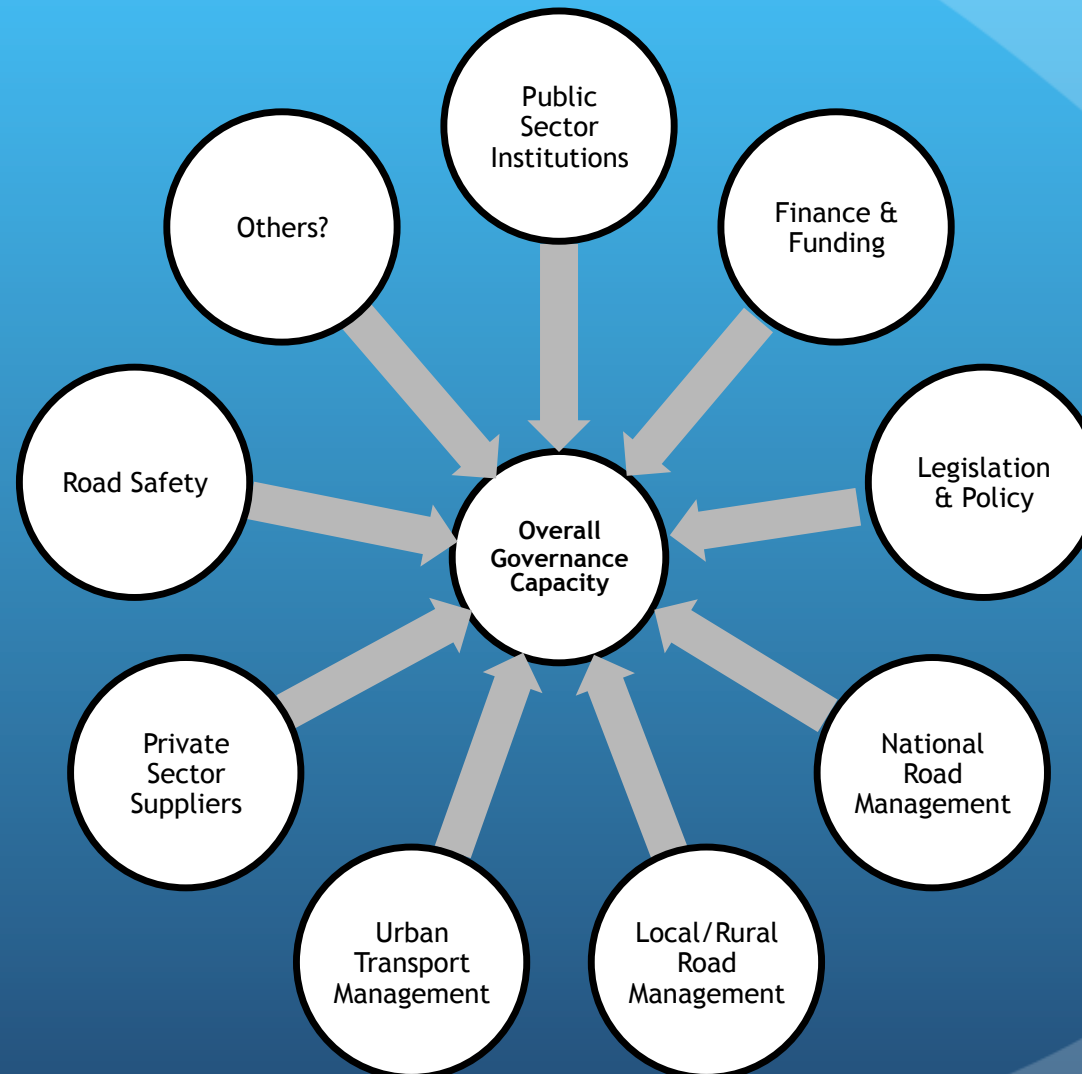

Purpose of this Session

- To consider whether measuring governance capacity in the roads sub-sector is a good thing? E.g. would it help to raise the importance of governance in the sector?
- To consider whether it can be measured in a sufficiently objective manner? E.g. would it help to measure areas of deficiencies and where progress in being made?
- To consider whether the overall methodology is appropriate and where improvements are possible?

Each Indicator would Assess Capacity in a Specific Area of Road Management

- Should every question have equal weighting? If not, how should the questions be prioritised?
- Should the indicators remain static or evolve over time?
- Can they be applied universally?
- How could the methodology be improved?
